WHERE WE WENT ::





MINISTRY MODELS REPRESENTED::

73% of campers and cabin leaders represent CAMPUS LIFE model 19% represent a CITY LIFE model

7% represent all other national models

MINISTRY SITES INFLUENCED ::

28% of camp eligible* ministry sites influenced by the YFC Camp experience (411 of 1456)

*Eligible ministry sites is defined as all ministry sites listed in Impact excluding JJM or 'Other.'


HOW DOES YFC CAMP INFLUENCE MINISTRY LEADER INVOLVEMENT AT THE LOCAL LEVEL?

32% of leaders at camp in 2018 state that they are involved in local YFC ministries because they were once a kid in that ministry program and/or a past camper making them an indigenous leader. Same as 2017.


35% of leaders at camp in 2018 state that they became more involved in local YFC ministries as a direct result of the experience they had at a previous YFC Camp. **A 5% increase from 2017!**

*These two stats exclude Project Serve leaders and applies to cabin leaders and LST members only.







74% of campers made a decision to deepen or begin their relationship with Jesus.


FUN FACTS::

- 3097 total people served (Campers, Cabin Leaders, Lead Support Teams)
- 151 meals were served which translates into 428,085 dishes!
- Cumulative PS volunteer hours over 11 camps = 27,850. That translates into \$333, 840 (based on NY state minimum wage)

MOVEMENT SPECTRUM

PURPOSE: We have always collected the standard three responses of "Yes," "Yes again," and "Not Yet." However, our goal is not **just** to help move kids to a place of saying Yes to Christ for the first time in their lives. We also desire to see everyone experience Jesus and move closer to Him no matter where they are at on their faith journey. In an end-of-week survey, campers rated where they believed themselves to be on the spectrum before they arrived to camp and where they believed themselves to be after being at camp for the week. Each dot on the spectrum was assigned a numerical value for the purposes of data analysis.
