Depending on the size of your group, you might consider splitting up into multiple breakouts, or choose one and do it all together. Trauma Factors and Awareness

Oftentimes, our cultural background may prove to be a hindrance to creating authentic Christ-sharing relationships when we are doing ministry amongst young people with a different cultural heritage from our own. Join us as we explore Paul's example of becoming "all things to all men" so that that more young people may hear the good news of Jesus.

In addition, they will take some time to reflect with ministry leaders on their own personal journey in this area and steps they can take to care well for themselves.

Helpful tips:

- Recommend to your attendees to bring pen/pencils and paper for notetaking (or your chapter/ ministry site may choose to provide this as a welcome gift).
- Set up tables & chairs for all attendees to sit and gather around.
- Consider providing bottled water and simple snacks.
- Ensure all technology (computer and/or projector/screen) are ready to go*
- If meeting with a larger group, consider setting up several rooms for multiple breakouts to attend.
- Print out and display or hand out the day's schedule up for easy reference



HOW TO UTILIZE THE CONTENT

By registering for MLC 2022 you have full on-demand access to all content, even after the suggested MLC date of January 29. If you and your team are following the suggested schedule for your day, you will go through the content as listed on the schedule, and utilize the downloadable resources and handouts as you follow along.

Many of the breakouts have questions and prompts to pause the video, or a built-in countdown for you to connect in small groups. You can always pause the video and use more time if needed.





TECHNOLOGY REQUIREMENTS AND TIPS

In order to have a great day of training for you and your team, you need to ensure you have the appropriate technology to engage with the content.

A link to all of the on-demand content (videos, resources, and handouts) will be emailed to all registered chapters on January 24 to allow each host preparation time to share MLC content with their teams.

You can choose to download the videos and handouts, or forward the links onto others within your chapter and stream the content on Vimeo. The videos will be password protected, with the password included in the email containing a link to the content.

TECHNOLOGY REQUIREMENTS AND TIPS

General Tips:

- Consider downloading the videos onto a laptop so you don't have to worry about streaming or wifi issues.
- If you have Pro Presenter (or similar software) you can input all of the videos in the order you will watch them and ensure smooth transitions. You can also embed them into a Power Point or Keynote presentation as well and add any slides of your own between (with local branding, crowd breaker questions, announcements, or other info), or you can just open each video up, drag it onto the display screen and hit play.
- All of the videos do have a captioned option on Vimeo, so if you are streaming the videos, simply click the "CC" button on the bottom right and the captions will be displayed.
- Consider having someone specifically tasked to run tech for the day. Make sure to do a dry run and check that everything works first.



Tips for Large Groups:

If you are gathering in a large group to utilize the content, we recommend having a projector and screen large enough for everyone to see well, and amplified sound.

Tips for Small Groups:

If gathering in a small group we would recommend connecting your computer to a television, a projector and screen, or even a large monitor. If your computer speakers are not adequate, consider a speaker to plug into or connect to with blue tooth.

Tips for Virtual Gatherings:

If gathering virtually, send links to the handouts and downloads for the breakouts you'll be watching, to all the participants. We suggest that you all gather on zoom together, and spend some time connecting before engaging in the content. Rather than watching alone, we would also suggest that one person (someone well-versed with Zoom) play the videos from their computer and share the screen, so that they can control and pause if necessary, and everyone can follow along at the same time.
