

Community Ministry Start-Ups:

STRIES Developing a Juvenile Justice Ministry Model from a City Life Ministry Model

Purpose:

How to start a Juvenile Justice Ministry Model in your chapter from an existing City Life Ministry Model

Steps:

- 1. Study: JJM 101, JJM PSBPs, First Encounter, Aftercare, Diversion, Processes Timeline, JJM in a Box
- 2. Contact a JJM specialist to begin coaching: jjm@yfc.net
- 3. Identify common areas where young people have contact with the juvenile justice system:
 - a. Community
 - i. Alternative schools
 - ii. Day programs
 - iii. Probation or parole officers
 - iv. Diversion programs
 - b. Courts
 - i. Judges, public defenders, state attorneys
 - c. Corrections
 - i. Juvenile Justice Facilities (detention, long-term commitment, group homes, etc.)
- Conduct a community listening tour with key stakeholders from the above common areas (Community, Courts, Corrections) regarding the needs of the parenting teens they are seeing.
 - a. See <u>Community Listening Tour Questionnaire</u> in Knowledge Base.
- 5. Analyze data collected from listening tour and determine which pathway is most conducive in serving parenting youth in your context: Community, Courts, or Corrections. We recommend starting with **one** of these areas! Examples may include but are not limited to:
 - a. Community: City Life leaders connect with probation officers to offer mentoring
 - b. Courts: City Life leaders connect with a judge to receive mentoring referrals for youth who live in the neighborhood they're serving



- c. Corrections: City Life leaders begin to intentionally conduct RMAs with youth at a local facility.
- 6. Start a prayer team to pray for the young people from the specific community
 - a. Consider having board members and Community Support Team to be part of these prayer team(s).
- 7. Recruit at least 5 ministry leaders to begin to do holistic ministry with young people
 - a. Find and Win ministry leaders to serve in new JJM ministry site
 - i. Opportunity to <u>Lift</u> current ministry leaders
 - b. Recruit in pairs. Ministry Leaders feel more invested when they have someone to do ministry with
- 8. Begin Training: See JJM Vimeo Trainings
- 9. Identify community partners (local churches, community centers, etc.) to help provide opportunities deepen Authentic Christ Sharing Relationships with young people and provide holistic care.
- 10. Input new JJM site into <u>YFC Impact</u>
- 11. Have Ministry Leaders begin to do Relational Ministry Actions. Start with one or two that make sense for your context!
- 12. Continue to use ministry process timeline to foster growth of JJM new ministry site
